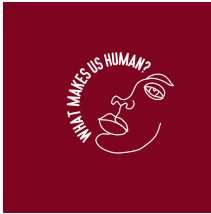

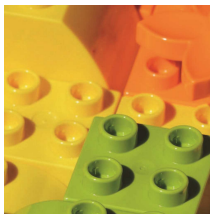
Stemm Cell Drive at TUM Main Campus
